Capitalism and true democracy are not compatible. Democratic socialism means the people have control over economic issues, along with political issues.

What is Democratic Socialism?

Under a healthy democracy, people rule. In reality, banks, financial institutions, and corporations have amassed more power than the government itself! Their decisions impact us all, but no one elected them and they are not accountable to anyone. Their only motivation is their bottom line.

Economic and political decisions which affect the lives of ordinary people should be under popular control.

Capitalism limits democracy because the economic elite can buy power that should be in the hands of the people.
